




Lake County 2050 Overview

- Comprehensive update to the General Plan, including all eight Local Area Plans:
 - Cobb Mountain
 - Kelseyville
 - Lakeport
 - Lower Lake
 - Middletown
 - Rivieras
 - Shoreline Communities
 - Upper Lake-Nice
- Environmental review
- Climate Adaptation Plan
- Housing Action & Implementation Plan



What is a General Plan?

- Long-range plan, mandated by State law
- "Constitution" for development and conservation
 - Establishes countywide vision and supporting goals, policies, and actions
 - Provides consistent direction for future development
 - Balances growth, conservation, and quality of life
 - Documents baseline environmental conditions







Components of the General Plan

Required Topics

- Land Use
- Open Space
- Circulation
- Housing*
- Conservation
- Safety
- Noise
- Environmental Justice

Optional Elements in Current General Plan


- Aggregate
 Resources Management Plan*
- Agricultural Resources
- Geothermal Resources
- Public Facilities and Services
- Water Resources

*The Aggregate Resources Management Plan will be updated separately on a different schedule.

^{*}The Housing Element will be updated separately on a different schedule.

What are Local Area Plans (LAPs)?

- Cover some required General Plan topics as well as additional, optional topics
- Consistent with all countywide elements and carry equal weight
- Reflect local characteristics
- Provide detailed policy and design guidance for the LAP area and for some communities ("special study areas")
- Include zoning maps that correspond to the LAP land use designations

What is Environmental Justice?

The fair treatment and meaningful involvement of people of all races, cultures, incomes, and national origins, with respect to the development, adoption, implementation, and enforcement of environmental laws, regulations, and policies.

CALIFORNIA GOVERNMENT CODE §65040.12(E)




Environmental Justice Element – Senate Bill 1000

- In disadvantaged communities:
 - Reduce pollution exposure and improve air quality
 - Promote public facilities
 - Promote food access
 - Promote safe and sanitary homes
 - Promote physical activity
- Engage the community in decisionmaking
- Prioritize improvements and programs that address needs in disadvantaged communities



Identifying Disadvantaged Communities in Lake County


- The State of California provides guidance to identify disadvantaged communities based on several indicators related to:
 - Pollution Burdens
 - Exposures
 - Environmental Effects
 - Population Characteristics
 - Sensitive Populations
 - Socioeconomic Factors



- Where are low-income areas?
- Which of those low-income areas are disproportionately impacted by environmental pollution and other hazards?

| Project initiation, background research, website/initial outreach | Fall 2023 – Spring 2024 |
| Draft Countywide Element updates, Local Area Plan updates initiation and alternatives | Spring – Fall 2024 |
| Draft Local Area Plans | Fall 2024 – Spring 2025 |
| Environmental Impact Report | Spring 2025 – Spring 2026 |
| Public review and adoption | Spring – Fall 2026 |
